Frequently Asked Questions

When does the outdoor season start?

The community outdoor season starts approximately the third week of April, weather permitting, and finishes at the end of June. The Aztec travel program continues to the end of July or August.

What do I need for registration?

The player's fee, a completed registration form and proof of age.

What nights are my child's games?

Aztec (Travel)

Our Aztec travel program has its schedule determined by the Calgary Minor Soccer Association. We do have some flexibility determining practice nights but we still are restricted by field and coach availability. Airdrie games are held at the Monklands Soccer park.

What equipment is needed?

Airdrie Soccer provides the shirt, socks and shorts. Players must provide either a good pair of running shoes or cleats and a pair of shin pads. Shin pads must be worn at all practices and games. If a player does not have them on, they cannot play! As shorts are provided, you might also want to have wind pants for the rainy and cool days. These pants cannot be snap pants due to safety concerns. Uniforms are the association's property until the end of the last game of the season. No alterations or vandalism can occur or the player will not be allowed to play as per ASA rules.

How do I find out what team my child is on?

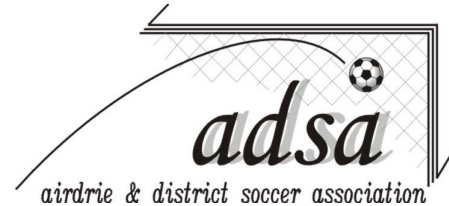
Coaches will contact the players and arrange for a first practice and distribution of schedules. This is usually done by the third week of April, depending upon the weather.

Are there any tournaments for my child?

The mini-festival for U6 /U8/U10 is tentatively scheduled for June 13-14th at the MR site. The U12 to U16 tournament is tentatively scheduled for June 20 & 21 at Monklands Soccer Park.

Provincial tournaments for the Aztec program depend upon qualification .

If the season doesn't start until April why is registration so early?

This gives the committee time to make up the teams, contact the coaches and prepare the packages. One of our biggest delays is finding coaches for all the teams and volunteers to help organize.

Where do the registration fee monies go to?

Our registration fees, per player, are composed of the following parts.

Field maintenance fees that go directly to the City of Airdrie	\$10 – \$30
Registration fees to the Alberta Soccer Association for training and insurance.	\$15
Referee costs	\$10 - \$15
Equipment, uniform and awards fees.	\$20 - \$30
Field improvement fees	\$10
Administration costs, field lining, sanitation costs, coaching clinics etc.	\$20 - \$30
CMSA fees (Aztec program)	as determined by CMSA

We are a non-profit organization and we are constantly seeking sponsorships to help keep the cost of soccer low and affordable.

What happens if the weather is really bad?

If you are not sure if games or practices are going to be held that day you can phone 403-912-7999 and a message will let you know if the field has been closed or not. The phone message is updated at 5 pm and 8 am on weekends, as field conditions change. This way parents/guardians can phone from work or home and not expect the coach to call.

Who do I phone to tell if my child will not be playing a certain game?

Your coach would like to know if your child will not be at a game or practice. Usually the coach makes up a game plan that is dependent upon your child being there. In certain circumstances the game can be defaulted if there are not enough players.

How can I help out?

In our association we understand that no one can do everything but everyone can do something! A hour or two of your time goes along way in the smooth running of our association.. Making up the equipment bags, sharing the phoning, assisting at the tournaments, helping with the players, and things that your coach may need all help tremendously and you will be surprised at the fun you will have. We are always looking for new, dedicated board volunteers. Meetings are held every third Sunday at 7:00 pm We have a small board and a lot of tasks to complete, and your volunteering is greatly valued.
